**ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE**

Supervision on campus begins at 8:15am. No child is to be on campus before 8:15am, as there is no supervision before that time. The first bell rings at 8:25 a.m. Students not physically in their classroom when the 8:30 a.m. bell rings are tardy and must go to the office for a tardy slip. Students are to exit campus immediately after dismissal and go straight home, except for those children enrolled in our after school day care program. Please communicate after school arrangements with your child in advance.

**SCHOOL WIDE COMMUNICATION**

Country Hills Elementary School and the Brea Olinda Unified School District are committed to keeping students and parents informed of all facets of school life. Please be sure the school has current contact information, including current email addresses and cell phone numbers. Expect to receive messages via email and phone. Please check the school website and the teacher websites for relevant information.

**GENERAL INFORMATION**

**Emergency Card:** In order for our telephone and emergency file to be complete and always up-to-date, we ask that you fill out an emergency card for each child each year. If there are any changes in this information during the school year, please contact our office so that our records will be accurate. In the event of an emergency, we must have a number at which someone can be reached.

**Off Campus Trip Permission Card:** This card is kept with your child's teacher. When students leave campus for any reason, the class set of cards accompanies them. This enables the teacher to have emergency contact numbers, should the need arise.

**Riding the Bus:** Please contact the BOUSD Transportation Department to obtain a bus pass for transportation to and from school. While most of the Brea school buses have seat belts, not all charter bus companies in Southern California are equipped with seat belts. Evidence shows that riding on a bus without a seat belt is just as safe as riding in a car with a seat belt because of the design of the seats on the bus.

**Insurance:** Student insurance is offered one time each year at the beginning of school. The application form is in the packet of information sent home the first day of school. If you feel this would benefit you, we encourage you to purchase it. The school district does not carry medical insurance for student injuries.

**Illness:** There is no nurse on duty at the school; we have an office Health Clerk. When a child is sick and/or running a temperature, parents will be called to come to pick up their child. The office staff has been trained in basic first aid practices, but if a child is seriously injured, the parents will be called immediately, and 911 if necessary. If your child has been ill, please do not send him/her back to school until he/she is completely well. If your child has been running a temperature or has vomited, do not send him/her back to school until the temperature has been normal/vomiting has stopped for at least 24 hours.

**Medications:** MEDICATION CANNOT BE ADMINISTERED BY SCHOOL PERSONNEL unless the required parent permission and doctors orders forms have been completed and filed in the office.

**Personal Property:** The school is not responsible for personal property. No iPod players, electronic devices/equipment/games, etc., are permitted at school without proper permission. We ask that students not bring valuable items or large sums of money to school. Please place the full name of your child on all of his/her belongings. This is very important if you want the articles returned if found. Lost articles are kept in the Lost and Found Box. This box is overflowing each year with jackets, sweaters, sweatshirts, etc. The unclaimed articles are donated to charity at the end of each trimester. Parents and students are encouraged to check the Lost and Found on a regular basis.

**Cell Phones:** For safety purposes, cell phones are allowed to be brought onto campus, but certain practices and procedures must be followed. **Students who choose to bring cell phones to school must keep them turned off and in their back packs while on campus, unless permission is given by your child's teacher to be used in class as a learning tool. There is to be no texting or phone calls during the school day.** Phones/devices that are confiscated for rules violations will be available for parent pick up from the school office.

**Bicycles/Skateboards/Rollerblades/In-line Skates:** For the safety of all students and staff in and out of classrooms we ask that all skateboards, skates, scooters, etc., be left at home. Such equipment will be confiscated and brought to the Principal's office. Students may ride their bicycles to school and racks are provided for parking. Students should lock their bicycles to the rack with their own locks and MUST wear a helmet. Students are required to walk their bikes when on campus.

**Equipment:** All equipment used at recess will be provided by the school. No toys of any kind, balls, bats, etc., are to be brought from home unless they are donated to the classroom.

**Cafeteria Service:** The BOUSD Food Services Department utilizes MySchoolBucks to pay for school meals. A nutritious lunch which includes milk is served daily for \$2.75\*. Milk can be purchased separately for \$0.50\*. Cookies and juice bars are also sold. For low-income families, free or reduced-priced meals are available via Rocket Scan. The application form is sent home with every student registered on the first day of school and is available on-line and in the school's office. You must reapply each year for approval. The Food Services Department will allow children from the previous year to eat under their last year's status for one month. After that time, if a new application is not received, free or reduced-price meals will be denied. Prepaid lunches are available to students. Any number of lunches may be purchased at the regular daily price. You may purchase lunches via the school district website, [myschoolbucks.com](http://myschoolbucks.com) or you may send a check to school made payable to "BOUSD" \*Prices subject to change

**Eating Areas:** Students may eat only in the lunch bench areas. Recess snacks may be eaten by bike racks. Students must clean up after themselves on a daily basis. Failure to do so will result in school service (trash detail). Everyone must help to keep our campus beautiful!

**Using the Telephone:** The telephones in the office and classrooms are to be used for emergencies only. Students are not allowed to call home to make personal arrangements; families should make arrangements prior to the school day.

**Off Limits Areas:** Students may not enter school rooms without a teacher or other adult. This rule is in effect before and after school and during all recesses.

**Walking to School:** Children are encouraged to use sidewalks, stay out of streets and off grass areas. Please check the safest route to school and encourage your children to use crossing guards or signals when crossing streets.

**Releasing Children from School:** Students are not allowed to leave the school grounds during the school day. Should you wish to pick your child up before the regular dismissal time, please come to the office to

sign your child out. We will summon him/her from class when you arrive on campus. Only those persons identified on the emergency card may pick up a child, and then only with proper identification.

**Pupil Absences:** Should your child be absent for any reason, please report your child's absence on our attendance hotline at (714) 990-7592. You may also request makeup homework while leaving your message. We discourage absences for any reason except illness. If a non-medical reason forces an absence from school for 5 or more days, you may request an Independent Study Contract. Contact the office right away for the Independent Study paperwork. All completed work and a log of study hours must be turned in when the student returns to school. The classroom teacher will assign a grade for the completed work before credit for independent study will be given. If the contract is not fulfilled, the student will receive unexcused absences for the time away from school. Students who accumulate excessive absences risk being retained for the next school year. Parents of students with excessive absences may be reported to the district School Attendance Review Board for legal action.

If a student is absent, the teacher will gladly provide work missed during the period of absence. Please allow the teacher ample time to gather that work. You should allow the teacher a minimum of 30 minutes after the students have been dismissed to prepare the assignment. When you leave a message about an absence on the attendance phone you may request homework. Keep in mind that homework is follow-up or unguided practice for the learning that has taken place in the classroom. If your child was not in the class when new material was presented, it may not be appropriate to give him homework based on the day's learning until after he returns and has been taught that particular lesson.

**Tardies:** Please make it a habit to be on time to school! Students must be in school for a minimum amount of time to be counted as present. This minimum day requirement is set by the State. Tardies will be shown for children who arrive late at school for unexcused reasons. While we understand family situations may occasionally cause students to be tardy, it is important that we all strive for punctuality. The Brea Olinda Unified School District works in cooperation with the Orange County District Attorney to assist with special circumstances involving student attendance issues. Students must report to office for a tardy slip in order to be admitted to class after the 8:30 bell rings. Please work hard to be on time so instructional minutes are not missed.

#### **REPORT CARDS, PROGRESS REPORTS AND CONFERENCES**

Report cards are issued three times during the school year. During the first trimester, parents will be requested to attend a conference with the teacher regarding the progress of their child. At times during the year, teachers and/or parents may have concerns they wish to express regarding progress in school. It is recommended that parents contact their child's teacher to alleviate any concerns at an early stage.

#### **DISASTER PLAN**

Our school is a designated disaster center and will be staffed by the Red Cross after 72 hours. For the first 72 hours after a disaster, children will be cared for by school personnel. Children will be released only to persons designated on the emergency card. Disaster information can be obtained from:

Please use the above media for information and pick your children up from school as soon as possible.

#### **DRESS CODE**

Student dress should indicate respect for the educational environment and should be modest, comfortable, clothing that is appropriate for the learning environment. If a student comes to school and because of his/her dress, hair, or other grooming is a distraction to others, parents will be notified to bring a change of clothing, make corrections or the student will be removed from class. Students may borrow clothing from the office to correct offense as well. Variances in student dress code only include school sponsored spirit days/and or activities, per the principal's direction.

- ✓ Closed-toe shoes only. No open-toed or backless shoes, like flip flops.
- ✓ Hats should be worn OUTSIDE only.
- ✓ Shorts should be at least fingertip length.
- ✓ No midriff baring, strapless or backless tops. "Spaghetti straps" are discouraged.
- ✓ Make-up, cosmetics, perfumes or other personal grooming items are not suitable for an elementary school campus.
- ✓ Students hair must be a natural hair color, and style or cut should not be disruptive (this includes mohawks, stripes or other exaggerated haircuts).
- ✓ No displays of rude language/obscenity/drugs/alcohol and/or violence are permitted on apparel.
- ✓ No clothing that is ripped, torn, or dirty or considered to be not appropriate for an elementary school learning environment.

## **VOLUNTEERS AND VISITORS**

Parents are vital to the success of our programs. Many volunteer opportunities are available at our school. If you wish to volunteer, contact your student's teacher or our PTA. All volunteers and visitors must complete a volunteer information sheet and sign in at the office when entering campus during instructional times. Please do not enter a classroom without clearance from the office. For the safety of all our students, adults are not allowed to use restrooms designated for student use. Please use the restrooms in the office.

## **STUDENT'S RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

All students have the right to be safe at school, free from harassment of any kind. Teasing, bullying, threats and discrimination are NOT TOLERATED under any circumstance. This includes words, drawings, physical gestures and cyberbullying. No student should harass another for any reason whatsoever, whether it be for personal habits, appearance, sex, race, religion, ancestry, or origin. Harassment through actions or words is a major offense which will result in serious disciplinary action. Students need to tell a staff member if they are being harassed in any way. Weapons of any kind are not tolerated under any circumstance.
